

It is the application that takes place before the Civil Registration Officer to record the death of a relative.

REQUIREMENTS

- Bolivian Passport or ID of the family of the deceased.

A third person may register the death through a Power of Attorney from family

- Legalized Death Certificate. Document must be certified by the Secretary of State where it was issued and authenticated by the State Department of the United States of America (See procedure [Legalization](#)).
- Translation of the death certificate. The Certificate of Death must be translated into Spanish, the General Consulate of Bolivia in Washington D.C. can translate (See procedure [translation](#)).

FEE

Registration of death in the Books of Death, including a Death Certificate (update to the family book is free): \$ 10.00

Legalization of a Death Certificate not granted by the Consul, between Bolivian individuals or a Bolivian individual with a foreign individual (original or photocopy): \$ 15.00

Translation of a Death Certificate not granted by the Consul: \$ 10.00.
